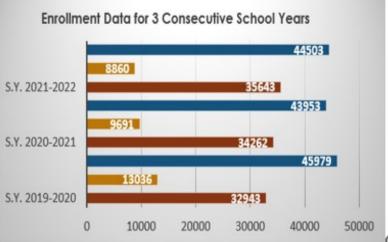

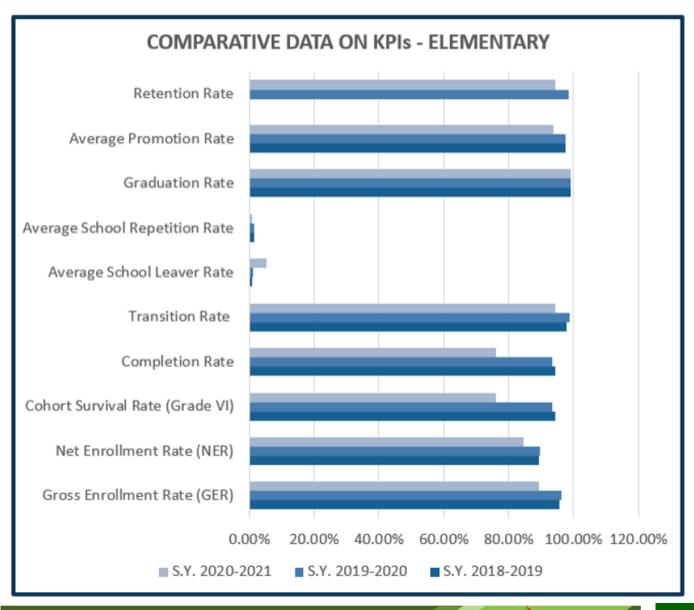

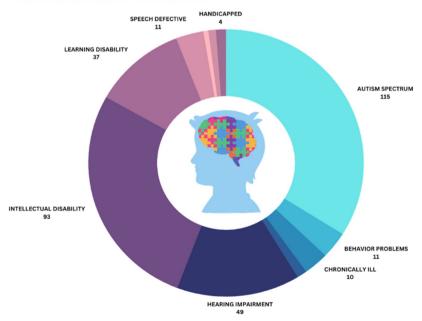

The present enrolment showed that most of the learners with special education needs fall under the ASD or Autism Spectrum Disorder for there are 115 learners followed by the learners with intellectual disability at 93. The learners with hearing impairment posted 49 learners, those with learning disability 37, speech defective and behavior problems at 11. The learners having health problems or chronically ill recorded 10 learners and those that are handicapped there are 4 learners.
